### EXAMPLE PROJECT

In FY2023, **EDA awarded \$1,981,419 in Economic Adjustment Assistance funds to support the Port of Hood River** with constructing a roadway in Hood River County River, Oregon, to help increase the port's capacity and boost its ability to serve regional businesses. The project work includes the construction of an approximately 550 linear feet and approximately 64 feet wide road, relocation, and the reconfiguration of approximately 750 linear feet and 60 feet wide road. In addition, there will be an installation of water, sewer, storm water, electrical, gas, and communications utilities infrastructure, and construction of a public transit hub central transfer facility.
